English language requirements

If your first language is not English, you will need to show proof of your English language ability. We accept a wide range of qualifications and tests. Different courses need different English language levels. Specific requirements are listed on individual course pages online.

If you have studied at a Nigerian high school or university, you will not usually need to provide additional evidence of your English language ability.


Scholarships
