

Dr Suzanne Egan is Assistant Professor in international human rights law, European human rights law and human rights education at the School of Law, University College Dublin and is also Director of the UCD Centre for Human Rights.

Suzanne has published widely in the field of international human rights law, with a particular focus on human rights institutions and procedures, asylum law and policy and human trafficking. Her book, *The UN Human Rights Treaty System: Law and Procedure* (Bloomsbury) was shortlisted for the Irish Association of Law Teachers, Kevin Boyle prize for outstanding legal scholarship in 2012 and in 2017, Suzanne was awarded an LL.D. by the National University of Ireland for her published work in the field of international human rights law.

Suzanne is a graduate of U.C.D. and Osgoode Hall Law School, Toronto and a qualified barrister. In 2000, she was appointed by the government to serve as a Member of the Irish Human Rights Commission and was subsequently re-appointed for a second term in 2006. She has been a visiting professor at De Paul Law School, Chicago, the University of Connecticut and a Visiting Fellow at Harvard Law School's Human Rights Program (2011-2012).
