The Scholarly Works Policy

Most journals allow you to upload your accepted manuscript to a repository, such as Pure, for free. Publishers often request that you embargo your work, but many funders require you to make your article available immediately on Publication. The University of Bristol's Scholarly Works Policy secures your permission to do so.

You can use this route if:

- Your article is not covered by an Open Access Deal. Search our database to see if it is: https://www.bristol.ac.uk/staff/researchers/open-access/read--publish--transformative-deals-/
- Your journal doesn't require an APC to publish there. Search the Directory of Open Access Journals to see if it is: https://doaj.org/

Checklist:

When You submit to the journal Include the following statement in your cover letter and acknowledgements: 'For the purpose of open access, the author(s) has applied a Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY) licence to any Author Accepted Manuscript version arising from this submission. If your publisher has any concerns about the statement, contact the library for help: lib-researchsupport@bristol.ac.uk Save your drafts during the peer review process. When your article is accepted Add a record to Pure (https://research-information.bris.ac.uk/pure). Upload a copy of your Accepted Manuscript (i.e. the version with all the peer review changes, but without publisher formatting. It's probably the last word file you sent them). **Upon Publication**
