Austin is a world leading expert in homeless health and his talk, entitled "Making Sense of Street Chaos – why homeless people do not use mainstream health services", was both inspirational and thought provoking.

Austin is a GP in Dublin and the founder of Safetynet which aims to improve the healthcare for homeless people in Ireland. He has won many awards for his work including the 2020 WONCA Europe Award of Excellence in Health Care. He also represented Ireland at the 2016 Paralympics.

Need help with routine practice work? from Kimberly Bruce

We had 4th and 5th year students this year. As part of their placements, we supervised them in measuring blood pressures, taking blood and processing samples. We also offered them the opportunity to do these as a paid role on a Saturday morning. All the fourth years took up this offer and have fed back that they have found it useful for their learning and are planning to come back as 5th years on a Saturday. We plan to do a joint induction in these skills for our new 4th and 5th years in the Autumn which should be more efficient and help build networks for the students across the years.

Improving Medicines use in People with Polypharmacy in Primary Care

Do you use EMIS and have a practice of over 6000 patients? Are you interested in improving delivery of medication reviews to patients with polypharmacy? CAPC is running the IMPPP trial and looking for enthusiastic practices to recruit 50 patients for structured medication reviews, starting from around September for 6 months. Training for clinicians is included, a pharmacist will be provided if you don't already have one, and practices will be reimbursed for trial activities with intervention practices receiving approx. £120 per patient reviewed.
