## COMMON EUROPEAN FRAMEWORK OF REFERENCE FOR LANGUAGES

The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (<u>CEFR</u>) has six broad descriptive levels A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2, each expressed a series of capability statements (e.g. "a student at this level can…").

Our University-wide Language Programme maps onto these levels as follows:

Intermediate	B1+ / B2	
Follow-on	B1+ / B2	
Advanced	B2 / C1	

For Japanese and Chinese, the units are benchmarked against the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JPLT) and the Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK):
