Prepare for a degree: at the University of Bristol

Short courses

- If you're wondering about time commitment or cost, our short courses will let you try out studying and build confidence.
- We offer short courses in Education, English, History, Philosophy and Social Policy. These courses run in the local Bristol area, one evening a week.
- Students who complete the course are encouraged to apply to our Foundation Year in Arts and Social Sciences.

Foundation Year in Arts and Social Sciences

• If you do not have standard qualifications, or have no prior qualifications, you can apply to our Foundation Year in Arts and Social Sciences.

- This one-year course is taught on Mondays and Tuesdays, from 10 am to 3pm at the University.
- Satisfactory completion allows students to progress to a number of undergraduate degrees in the Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences.

Prepare for a degree: at a local college

Access to Higher Education Diploma

- Access to HE Diplomas are designed with adults in mind and provide preparation in specific subjects.
- These one-year full-time courses are available at most local colleges, including: Bath College, Bridgwater and Taunton College, City of Bristol College, South Gloucestershire and Stroud College and Weston College.

Apply for an undergraduate degree

- We offer a wide range of degrees, in fields such as science, engineering, health sciences, arts and social science.
- Most of our undergraduate degrees require evidence of recent study.
- Entry requirements vary per course and can be found on individual course pages: **bristol.ac.uk/study/undergraduate**

Tips for mature students with existing qualifications

- The accepted amount of time passed since completing your last qualification varies for each course.
- Some courses require study within the last year, whereas others require study within the last five years.
- You can view individual course requirements in our admissions statements: bristol.ac.uk/study/undergraduate/ apply/admissions-statements

Tips for Access to HE Diploma students

- It's a good idea to check that your Access subjects are suitable for your chosen degree course.
- Applicants must be on track to meet the Access to HE Diploma offer stated on individual course pages.
- We encourage mature students to submit their UCAS application while undertaking their Access to HE course.

- Means-tested funding is available for our short courses and the Foundation Year.
- The Advanced Learner Loan is available from the government to cover the costs of studying a level 3 course, such as Access to HE Diplomas.
- Your college will tell you how to apply for this loan.
- Some Access to HE Diplomas may be available as distance learning.



For full-time undergraduate degrees, you need to apply through UCAS: **www.ucas.com**

- **15 October:** Deadline for medicine, veterinary science, and dentistry.
- **15 January:** Deadline for most full-time undergraduate degrees.
- A number of our full-time undergraduate degree courses can be studied on a part-time basis.
- We are developing new, flexible ways of studying at undergraduate level, which includes a BA in English Literature and Community Engagement studied one evening per week for six years.

Mature student support

Financial support

Tuition fees

- If you take out a loan from the government (Student Finance England), this will cover your tuition fees and you will not have to pay anything up front.
- How much you pay back each month will be proportionate to how much you earn.
- You can apply for Student Finance before you have heard back from your university choices: www.gov.uk/apply-online-forstudent-finance

Support with living costs

Your household income will determine the level of financial support you are eligible for.

- The maximum a full-time University of Bristol student could receive from the government Student Loan's Company is £8,944*.
- The University offers a range of bursaries including the Bristol Bursary of up to £2,060* (does not need repaying).
- Additional support may be available if you have children or dependents, benefits entitlement, a low income and/or a disability.

If you're 60 or over on the first day of the first academic year of your course, you can apply for up to $\pounds3,783^*$.
