ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

If the funding for your work comes from the Wellcome Trust ISSF you must acknowledge it in your publications and communications. Preferred wording is as follows:

'This work is/was supported by the Elizabeth Blackwell Institute, University of Bristol and the Wellcome Trust Institutional Strategic Support Fund.'

The WT ISSF3 grant code (should you need it) is 204813/Z/16/Z

In all other cases please use the name of the funder (found on your award letter):

'This work is/was supported by the Elizabeth Blackwell Institute, University of Bristol and the [add name of the funder].'

Please use 'Elizabeth Blackwell Institute' in full. We are avoiding using the abbreviated 'EBI' for anything other than very 'internal' use (i.e. within the University of Bristol, for internal emails).
