Learning and Teaching: Renewing our ageing estate with modern facilities, driving the trajectory of our education, student and learning environment.

Research and Innovation: Forging the best facilities, enhancing our academic environment to drive our research, enterprise, and innovation outcomes.

Net-Zero Carbon: Ensuring we meet our Net Zero targets while delivering the University's vision.

Our solutions are interconnected.

Each challenge fuels the other, driving us towards our vision.

By addressing them collectively, we unlock opportunities.

And by creating spaces that adapt and transform, we support collaboration and long-term growth.

New campuses unlock land value and partnership potential for a future modern estate and allow for reward and risk sharing.

We need to evolve as a global civic university, shifting from thinking about individual buildings, to a shared and digital estate, capable of a longer life and looser fit, with the flexibility to meet our needs.
