This year's conference features an online gallery for posters, podcasts, videos or pre-recorded presentations accessible throughout the conference week.

We invite research students, doctoral researchers and academics to explore, share and reflect on key issues in educational research, policy, theory and practice from a broad range of research areas. We encourage contributions that align with the key themes of **reflection**, **representation** and **reshaping practice**. You are invited to respond to the themes directly or reflect on any aspect of your research from this past year.

The conference gallery will be hosted online and open throughout the conference week. Submissions can take many forms: visual, audio, animated or moving image. In this shared space, delegates will be invited to comment, question and discuss emerging themes throughout the week.

All successful submissions will receive a certificate of participation ... and there will be PRIZES!!! Posters will be judged on two criteria:

- Design: presentation and visual communication
- Content: how easily this can be understood by non-subject specialists

Please keep in mind that your audience will be from various cultural, linguistic and educational backgrounds. While we are all broadly familiar with educational research, policy, and practice, we may not have expertise on your topic.

By submitting a contribution to the gallery, you give permission for the material to be shared in the conference and through University social media channels.

Poster submissions

Your poster can be any design, size or format (landscape or portrait). You can use a mixture of text and image to create a layout that is engaging and easy to navigate. The poster can include photography, diagrams, illustration, graphs, charts.

Requirements:

- Title
- Name & affiliation (School/Department/University)
- Minimum font size 14pt
- Bibliography of sources used
- Submit your poster in a PDF format with file name poster_surname.pdf

Video, podcast or other multimedia submissions

Students are welcome to create multi-media showcase submissions. These include infographics, videos, animations or podcasts.

We encourage you to use any format to communicate your research or practice. If you are new to podcasts, an easy way is to use Zoom or Teams to make an audio recording. Audacity or a similar platform is a good choice for editing. There are now many free and simple resources online and apps for creating your own content. Even if you are new to these formats, we encourage you to try out new ways of communicating your research and practice in this friendly and supportive gallery space.

We welcome solo contributions or work created as a collaboration, for example you might record a conversation with a colleague about your work as a podcast, or you might make a video to visually communicate different methodological approaches. You can use animation, still imagery or video.

Requirements:

- Videos should be no longer than 3 minutes, and podcasts no longer than 5 minutes.
- All material should include name of presenter(s)/participant(s) within the audio/image and their institution.
- Consider accessibility of your submission, please see <u>Designing for Accessibility</u> and <u>Digital Accessibility</u> for guidance
- Please ensure any images or sound/music you use does not breach copyright. You can do this by using material that is copyright free or falls under creative commons licenses. All sources should be credited as an image or spoken credits.
