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Politics and International Relations with Study Abroad (BSc)

I applied to the Mentoring Scheme because I didn't know what career I wanted to pursue after graduation. By connecting with a Bristol graduate who had taken a similar degree, I hoped to get some useful advice and direction on how to apply my degree after graduation.

I was mentored by a political risk analyst, and one highlight was carrying out my own risk analysis project on US-China tensions – in particular, on the risks these tensions posed to the economy. This was a fascinating topic, and I was given a lot of freedom to research and explore the subject area. In completing the task my mentor set I gained valuable research and presentation skills.

My mentor was very approachable and helpful, which made the experience really enjoyable. I am now more confident and assured when engaging in professional environments and meetings, as I hadn't had much experience of this before.

Taking part remotely allowed me to connect with a mentor who worked in Singapore; it would not have been possible to make these connections otherwise.

I would definitely recommend the scheme to other students. It's an opportunity to gain experience and advice that can be balanced well with your studies and other commitments.
