All	Electrical shock with electrical supplies	Anyone	Low	 Equipment to be tested for electrical safety before the event. Have the materials away from the public and water as much as possible. If someone is hurt contact the First Aider. 	
All	Slips, trips, falls	Anyone	Low	 Ensure all boxes stowed beneath table. Any cables to monitors etc are taped to the floor where necessary but avoid running them across walkways. If someone is hurt contact First Aider. Any spillages to be mopped up immediately, if a large spillage occurs corner off and contact the porters. Staff to make sure that stands do not obstruct walkways or impede fire exits, and that they are stable. 	
All	Fire	Anyone	Very low	 All volunteers and staff attending on the day are asked to familiarise themselves with the nearest fire exit. Event helpers advised not to use the fire extinguishers unless they have been trained to do so. Staff will be on site so maximum numbers not exceeded. On discovering a fire activate the nearest call point or shout fire Exits and fire exits clearly marked. Access to exits and extinguishers to be kept clear at all times. Porters and building Fire wardens in attendance to evacuate buildings. Staff members or visitors requiring assistance in the event of fire should make themselves known to the porters when 	

				 entering the building. Emergency evacuation arrangements will be discussed with wheel chair users and those people needing any additional support prior to the event Staff and volunteers to calmly escort visitors out of the building via the nearest fire exit.
All	Violent incidents	Anyone	Very low	 Avoid confrontation. Security Services are present at the event and will provide expert help. Event helpers to inform a member of staff of any incidents and given access to security services number. Event helpers to avoid working alone, manage comfort breaks to keep maximum number of helpers on stalls.
All	Welfare	Anyone		 Toilets and washbasins available in the precinct Water and refreshments available for volunteers. Event helper training.
All	Lost visitors	Anyone	Medium	 Trained event helpers throughout the building. Use of PA system if needed to direct people to a meeting place. Do not give descriptive details of lost children out over the PA system.
All	Health/Illness	Anyone	Low	 Visitors will put as much or little effort into activity as they chose. Activities will be supervised and inappropriate behaviour discouraged. Appropriate warnings given at individual activities depending on if there is a risk to health. Adequate numbers of first aiders available. Porters lodge closest contact. Models with small parts or heavy objects	Small parts present risk of chocking, heavy object	Children	Low	 Participants to be supervised at all times. Activity chosen to suit age group, i.e. participants are unlikely to put small parts in their mouths. Supervise to ensure not dropped on feet.
Preserved specimens for display	Spillage of preserving solutions and subsequent exposure	Anyone	Low	 Specimens will be stored in low risk solutions and contained in fully sealed plastic receptacle to minimise risk of breakage. Supervised at all times. Staff trained in appropriate handling of solvents. There will also be a spillage kit containing eye wash in case of exposure to the solution. Signs saying they are not to be handled.
Fixed samples to be handled	Exposure to low levels of fixing solutions and biological samples	Anyone	Low	 Specimens will be stored in low risk solutions (fixed in formaldehyde and then washed in H₂0 to remove excess and stored in H₂0) Participants only allowed to handle samples if they wear gloves. Participants to be supervised at all times. Hand washing facilities located nearby.
Activities involving small parts or	Participants may be injured.	Anyone	Low	 Participants supervised at all times. Adults use of scissors or provision of age appropriate equipment

Knit a neurone	Exposure to sharp equipment (needles, pins, knitting needles, crochet hooks)	Anyone	Low	 Activity will be supervised at all times by activity leaders. Equipment will be monitored carefully and removed from anybody using it incorrectly.
Use of IT equipment (poster activity and evaluation)	Participants dropping equipment	Anyone	Low	Supervised use of equipment at all times.
Nerve stimulation and exposure to potentially noxious stimuli	Possible electrical burn from the stimulator	Anyone	Low	 A safety cut off has been built into the stimulator to prevent this. Activity to be supervised at all times. Check participants do not have any existing heart conditions or pacemakers. Sign in place warning that this activity involves a mild electric shock
Battery powered equipment	Electric shock Exposure to corrosive liquids	Anyone	Low	Activity and equipment to be supervised at all times.
Activities involving insects	Exposure to insects including handling parts of the animal Use of ethanol and nicotine solutions.	Anyone	Low	 Activity to be supervised at all times. Live animals to be contained at all times Clean up any breakages immediately.
