Zoom

Thank you for registering for the 2020 BCFN Annual Conference and NanoMedTwin Conference. After registration Zoom will have send you a link (“click here to join”) for the conference, you can use the same link for each session. Without registration you cannot attend.

You will not be able to turn your microphone or camera on during the conference, but you can communicate via the chat, which is accessible via an icon on the tool bar at the bottom of your screen.

If you want to pose questions to the speaker, use the Q&A for this ONLY. Q&A is accessible via the same toolbar at the bottom of your screen. You are free to pose questions during the talk, your questions are visible to everyone. If a question has already been asked, you can upvote that same question. The question with the most votes will be addressed first via the chair at the end of the talk.

Please make yourself familiar with the programme for day 1 [here](#) and for day 2 [here](#). There is additional information available on the talks and the speakers. We ask that you attend the full session. Although we are not expecting any technical issues, should something come up then the order of speakers may change to allow for trouble shooting.

Slack

Slack is the platform we use for the poster sessions and to communicate during breaks. Please make a Slack account prior to the conference, this only takes a few moments. We encourage you to use your full name and research interest to help the conversation.

You can join the Slack conference space [here](#), in the column on the left hand side you will find a list of channels. There is a break_chat channel where you can interact in between sessions and a technical_issues channel should you need any assistance.

Please have a look at the available poster sessions [here](#). The poster titles are linked to the allocated Slack channels, alternatively you can search in Slack using the number for each poster. You can pose a question or comment at any point in the channel chat. Students will be available to answer any questions during the allocated poster slots.

Acceptable Behaviour
