

Recruitment completed

966 individuals have now signed up to participate in BRIST-IVF (The Bristol IVF Study), to help improve future outcomes for IVF treatment. This includes 501 women undergoing IVF/ICSI together with 445 male and 20 female partners.

We would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who has taken part over the last 4 years! This part of the study will now be closing to new recruits, but we will still be inviting those already in the study to the pregnancy follow up.



If you are part of the study and become pregnant, we will contact you to see if you would like to join our pregnancy follow up at the University of Bristol. This will involve questionnaires and a clinic at the University of Bristol.
