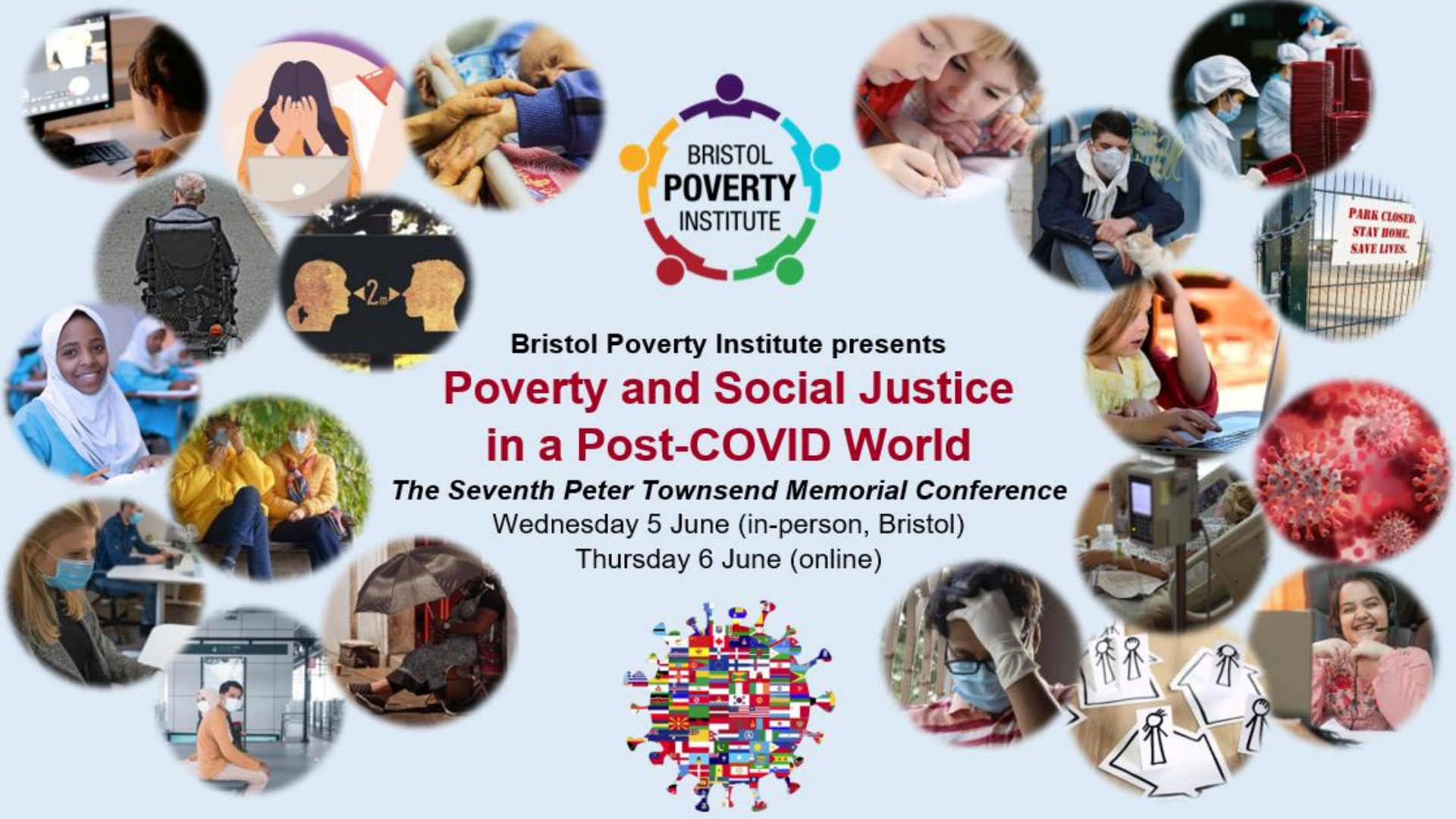

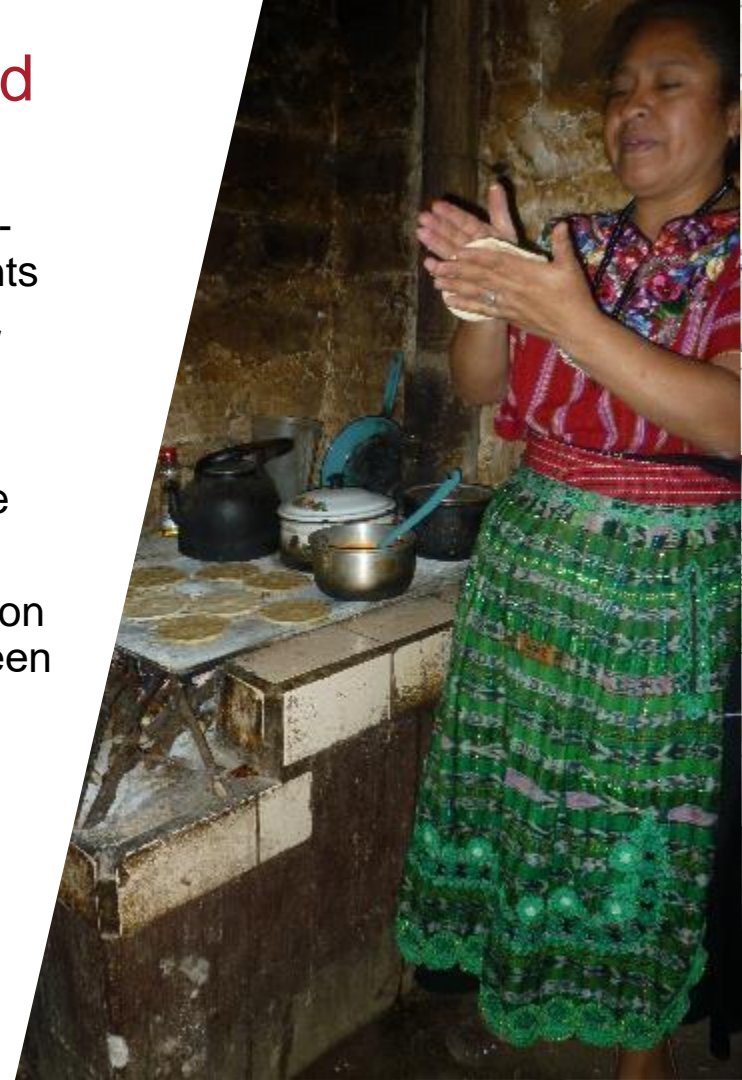
Introducing our Conference: Poverty and Social Justice in a Post-COVID World
