

# Safety-Netting Coding Tool (SaNCoT) user licence

By downloading and using the Safety-Netting Coding Tool (SaNCoT) you agree to be bound by the following terms and conditions:

1. University of Bristol (“UoB”) hereby grants you (“Recipient”) a royalty free non-exclusive licence to use the SaNCoT for the purpose of carrying out research, teaching and self-assessment of consultations with patients (“Purpose”). For clarification, it is not to be used for commercial purposes.
2. Except to the extent necessary for the Purpose, the Recipient shall not sub-license, distribute, adapt, modify, translate transfer, sell, exploit or use the SaNCoT in any way or for any other purpose without the prior written permission of UoB.
