Student Elective prizes

The **Nathan Burton Prize in Primary Care** is worth £250 and is available each year for one student who would like to study Primary Care during their elective period. You are eligible to apply for this prize in March of your 4th Year. The successful candidate must submit a report of their elective. The prize is advertised each year via the Galenicals Newsletter, the Year 4 update and GPSOC. To apply for this prize, you must complete and return the application form by the deadline at the end of May.

The **Royal College of General Practice** (RCGP) also has an elective prize worth £500 for medical students undertaking an elective in primary care worth. The deadline for this is also the end of May each year.

Student Conference Bursaries

Primary Care offers bursaries to attend conferences. The bursaries are available to students who have had posters or presentations accepted.

Up to £400 is available to support each student to attend an approved conference; this should cover the conference fees, modest accommodation, and travel (with receipts). Approved conferences are the RCGP or SAPC conferences although we will also consider applications to other conferences but the poster or presentation should have a primary care focus. GP Prizes

Each year, students are asked to nominate their GP teachers for a **GP Teacher Prize**. These GP teachers teach students in their practices across the South West. These GPs invest a lot of time and enthusiasm in their teaching and we want to reward them for this. Therefore each year we give 6 awards to our GP teachers. There is an award for the best teacher of each year as well as the best supervisor of an external student selected component (SSC). Students are asked to nominate GPs by completing a brief online survey which we make available each year. The recipient of each award will be the GP with the most positive student nominations.

We also offer an **Academy Practice Prize**, nominated by the Academy GP Lead and central teaching team for a teaching practice that has gone 'above and beyond' in their delivery of undergraduate teaching.
