

**Opportunity to take part in the University's Medical Admissions interviews. Please find below a letter from our Medical Admissions Team:**

Dear Colleagues

I hope this email finds you well, the admissions cycle is upon us again and I am looking to recruit assessors.

The interviews will run as follows:

- Three assessors will be placed in a breakout room together on either the red circuit or the blue circuit, you will remain in your breakout room for the duration of your session
- There are six interview stations in total, your breakout room will cover three of these stations
- Assessors will take one station each but will score the candidates answers to all three stations
- Each station lasts for five minutes and consists of one opening question and several follow up questions
- Assessors will be notified at the end of each five-minute interval at which point you must move onto the next station
- Assessors will be provided with a Microsoft form to complete input their scores, assessors must score candidates independently
- Candidates will not be reading or have a copy of the questions in advance

The interview dates are:

**January 2025** - Mon 13th, Tues 14th, Wed 15th, Thurs 16th

**January 2025** - Mon 27th, Tues 28th, Wed 29th, Thurs 30th

**February 2025** - Mon 10th, Tues 11th, Wed 12th, Thurs 13th

**February 2025** - Mon 24th, Tues 25th, Wed 26th, Thurs 27th

**Session 1** = 08:45am - 11:05am **Session 2** = 11:20am - 1:40pm **Session 3** = 2:00pm - 5:00pm

All of the sessions will be run on Zoom, the link and passcode will be sent to you the week before in the reminder email.

Ahead of each interview day you will receive a training video, we also hold an assessor briefing at the beginning of each session.

I always endeavour to pair up clinicians with non clinicians, first time assessors with experienced assessors and so on.

**There is no monetary reward for your time**, but both the University, and the GMC, recognise the important role that medical student selection plays in shaping the future health service therefore, all assessors receive a certificate of contribution, evidence which may be useful in appraisal, revalidation and job planning.
