

# Socially Inclusive Cities Network

- PI: Ghazala Mir, Leeds Institute of Health Sciences. Academic and non-academic partners: India, Kenya, Nigeria, Vietnam, UK (Leeds, Bristol).
- National/global review of evidence regarding drivers of and practical solutions to ethnic and religious disadvantage - access to + outcomes from public services (education, health, government and police). SDG 10/11
- Methods: National/global literature reviews. Input from 300 policy makers, service providers, disadvantaged groups, NGOs, 3<sup>rd</sup> sector partners, academics. 4 national workshops, 4 international workshops.
- Outputs: report from all stages, and final overview, from partner countries; global evidence review; and final over-arching research strategy for further discussions regarding evidence gaps and effective strategies to address inequalities at macro, meso and micro levels.
- Symposium outcomes: New collaborations with existing network leads to develop recommendations for future joint RCUK bids
