

Core Measurement Set

As part of the **iBRA-NET** initiative, **Miss Shelley Potter** and her team are developing a standardised way of measuring the outcomes of implant-based breast reconstruction – 'a core measurement set' to improve the quality and comparability of future research.

We have already developed a core outcome set (what to measure) in breast reconstruction. The next step is to work out *how* to measure these key outcomes. This includes determining what complications should be included in 'implant complications'; what standardised definitions of each complication we should use; what PROMs to use and when these outcomes should be assessed.

It would be fantastic if you would be willing to help.

Participation involves completing 2 questionnaires as part of a Delphi process. There will then be a consensus meeting to finalise and agree the final core measurement set at the iBRA-NET meeting in Birmingham on 11th November.
