Remember that disabled people may have different needs to those of other people.

Meet expectations of good quality care and reasonably adjusted care



Good quality care is what we should all expect as patients, such as being fed, keeping warm, being able to bathe.

Reasonable adjustments are more than this. They are the changes that you are required to make to ensure that disabled people are not disadvantaged when accessing health services.

- Check whether a patient is disabled and requires reasonable adjustments
- Discuss the nature of any adjustments with them
- Provide necessary reasonable adjustments
- **Review** to ensure the person's needs are being met
- **Record** for future hospital attendances
