World-leading research and teaching excellence at Bristol

We're proud of our established record of producing groundbreaking research that makes an impact on society at local, national and international levels.

By starting your research career at Bristol, you'll join a community of around 3,500 postgraduate researchers (PGRs) from all over the world.

Bristol Doctoral College

The Bristol Doctoral College (BDC) supports the growth of our postgraduate research community, enabling you to thrive during your degree and beyond.

As well as keeping our PGRs up to date with training, opportunities and events, the BDC organises a programme of workshops, seminars and online resources to support you at every stage of your research degree.

Your research in the spotlight

The BDC coordinate 'Research without Borders', an annual celebration of the pioneering work of our postgraduate researchers, and 'Three Minute Thesis', a competition which challenges researchers to deliver a spoken presentation on their research topic in three minutes.

Join a vibrant community

The PGR Hub is a space in the centre of the campus dedicated to our postgraduate research community. Here you can meet with other researchers, grab a coffee, or attend events. The BDC also runs online events for those who aren't able to join us on campus.

Did you know?

- Bristol is a top five UK university for research (THE analysis of REF 2014).
- We received the HR excellence in Research award in 2010, and successfully retained it in 2015. This demonstrates our commitment to the career development of our employed researchers.
- Bristol has one of the largest concentrations of funding and support for doctoral research and training in the UK sector. There are more than 300 PhD studentships available each year across the whole spectrum of Bristol research.
- In early 2019, the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC) awarded Bristol nine Centres for Doctoral Training (CDTs)- the highest number awarded to any university in the country.
- Our seven Specialist Research Institutes reflect the strength and depth in key specialisms, from composites to migration. The five University Research Institutes draw together multidisciplinary research on the environment, health, digital futures, ways of living and data.
